**Around the Green.** Our new Green Contractor, Dicksons, have been busy since the end of the season. They have brought in some heavy duty equipment to 'deep scarify' the Green to get rid of the moss. The whole Green was also spiked to a depth of around 10" to improve aeration and drainage. Five ton of top dressing was then applied to the Green and brushed in to get rid of the bumps and hollows. A further two ton will be applied, probably in the Spring, once the 5 ton has settled. Work will done to correct some of the wooden edges.

A sample of soil around the heads at the entrance to the Green has been taken away for analysis as there were virtually no roots in the grass. It was quite impressive watching these guys and machinery in action.

On the Bar. I have received suggestions from other members to have Social members, a Bar voucher scheme added to the annual fees, small receptions such as weddings, and to sell toasties and real coffee. Some of these ideas would involve expenditure first (buying equipment) or a change of Licence and others would have to be put to an Annual General Meeting. However, I am sure the sub-committee will look at the overall picture before making recommendations. In the meantime, you may find that the bar does not open until later on Saturday and Sunday afternoons. The Honesty bar in the Gents Locker room is always available. Did you know that any member can bring in 10 friends into the Club at any time the bar is open with no restrictions on the number of visits. This may partly resolve the Social Membership issue.

**Constitution, Committee and Competitions sub-group** have been meeting over the last few months and will be in a position to update everyone on all those issues at the Annual General Meeting in February.
